EUSA GENERAL INFORMATION



The European University Sports Association (EUSA) is an umbrella organization that comprises National University Sports Associations (NUSA) from 47 European countries, providing sporting activities, educational events, and expertise in policy making and programming. The organization is well known within the sector as a safe and strong voice for university sports in Europe, promoting fair play values and supporting their membership by partnering with European Sports Federations and lobbying within the European Union, the Council of Europe, and other institutions for funding to improve the provision of sport. EUSA is a proud and active associated member of the International University Sports Federation (FISU), strategically cooperating also with other Continental University Sports Federations (CUSF), as well as key governing bodies and organisations active in the field of sport, education, and youth. Since its founding in 1999, EUSA has organised 16 seasons of the European Universities Championships, attracting student-athletes to 204 university competitions held across Europe. In five previous editions of the European Universities Games, around 19.500 student-athletes from across Europe have participated in the different sporting competitions organised during these multi-sports events. Through its Institute, EUSA also engages in several social responsibility projects and initiatives on various topics, including Anti-Doping, Dual Career, Equal Opportunities and Inclusion, Good Governance, Mobility, Safeguarding, Skills Development, Sustainability, and Volunteering.

Many of the projects are supported by the European Union. The highest body is the General Assembly, composed of representatives of the member associations, which elects the Executive Committee. Its members are responsible for the administration and running of EUSA and the execution of the main directives taken by the Assembly. The EUSA Executive Committee is led by the President, Adam Roczek, 1st Vice President, four Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Secretary General. Various EUSA commissions are in place to provide assistance and guidance to the many different activities EUSA is involved in. These commissions include the Technical Commission, Control Commission, Education Commission, Inclusion and Diversity Commission, Medical Commission, Student Commission, Branding and Marketing Council, and also other working bodies. EUSA's headquarters is located in Ljubljana, Slovenia, where a dedicated team of 12 staff members plus 4 volunteers/interns work together to manage daily operations and oversee International activities. As part of the European University Sports Association (EUSA), they play a vital role in supporting the development and promotion of university sports across Europe, ensuring smooth coordination of events, effective communication, and strong collaboration among member organizations.

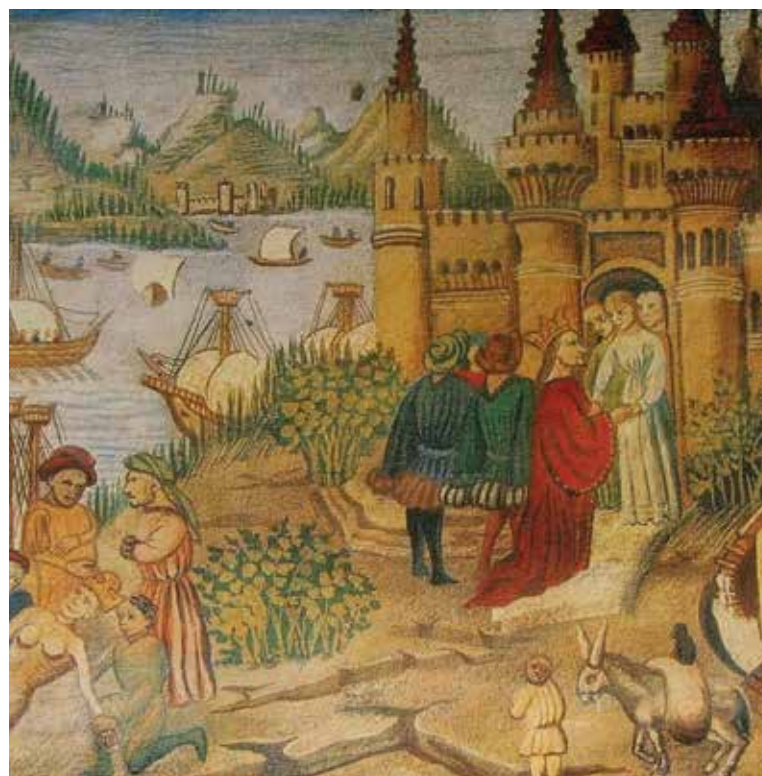
Salerno is a great example of what the Mediterranean has to offer to whoever is willing to discover it. The town itself is a visitors-friendly area, welcoming tourists from all over the world. In the last years the Municipality improved its urban areas and strengthened the socio-economic functions of the area: old monuments and churches were restored, new parks and gardens were opened in several areas, more plants and benches were added in several squares and streets together with decorative lighting, many areas were restored to artistic activities, the sports venues were improved thanks to new Stadium (Arechi). Several projects were carried out to improve the quality of life in some areas of the town. One can immediately notice the numerous footprints of ancient history mixed in the small handmade shops and leisure places where people gather, in the old town center, which is fascinating. Restoring the old town center was possible thanks to the funds for the urban project, which led to the discovery of new artistic and cultural treasures. Nowadays, one can clearly “read the history” of the town by simply looking at its narrow streets, squares, churches and buildings. One can perceive the events that have occurred, which are the testimony of the flourishing economic, social and cultural majesty over the centuries. The night-life rotates around the old town center. The Town Hall incentivized the opening of new restaurants and leisure centers. The pubs are packed with young people on the weekends until the dawn. In summer time people usually prefer some fresh air by the seaside, which is only a few- meter distance. Plenty of nightclubs are located on the coast.



SALERNO HISTORY HINT

We do not know much about the origins of Salerno, even though experts believe that the town was populated since the early age. The Greeks brought the farming of linen and wheat, olive and fruit, and the Etruscans brought the textile industry, together with the ceramic and bronze.

In 197/194 BC Salerno became a Roman colony under the name of Salernum. The colony progressed in culture and traditions, even under the Goths domination. The town became the most flourishing center in Southern Italy under the Lombard domination. In 786 Arechi II moved his Dukedom from Benevento to Salerno to run away from Carlo Magno and take control of a strategic area between the coast and the rural areas. The Prince fortified the town, which already had the castle on the Bonadies Hills, with towers and walls, and the new Campidoglio became the headquarter of the principedom and a political center as well. During the kingdom of Arechi II Salerno enjoyed great splendour, becoming the center of the oldest Medical Institution of Western Europe. The Famous "Scuola Medica Salernitana" was well-known for its precious scientific discoveries, which are still crucial nowadays. On December 13, 1076 The Roman warlord Roberto il Guiscardo conquered Salerno putting an end to the domination. Under the Norman domination the Castle and the Terracina Cathedral were built; great importance was given to science, especially to the Faculty of Medicine. By the end of the century the town experienced economic growth thanks to the Normans arrival. Manfredi, Federico II's son, built the Bay that still today is named after him. He started the very first Saint Matthew's ceremony, the most significant in Southern Italy.

The Queen Margherita of Durazzo settled in Salerno after the Angevin conquest. She is buried in a decorated tomb made by the famous sculptor Barbocio da Piperno. After the XVI century most of the Province was ruled by the SanSeverinos, powerful princes who attracted many artists and intellectuals to the town. The last heir of the SanSeverinos opposed the Spanish Government, and the decay of the town began. The years from 1656 to 1694 were particularly hard for the whole town..

UNIVERSITY OF SALERNO HISTORY

The University of Salerno (UNISA) is linked to most ancient and famous Institution of Europe: the Schola Medica Salernitana, a prestigious Medical Institution. Founded in the VIII century AD, the Institution reached its peak between the X and the XIII century. Besides medicine, the lectures included philosophy, theology and law. The Institution, which gave Salerno the title of Hippocratica Civitas (City of Hippocrates, a famous Greek writer and doctor), was closed following a Decree of 1811 under Gioacchino Murat's Napoleonic Government. In 1944, following the King Vittorio Emanuele III's decree, the University Institute Giovanni Cuomo was founded. It became Faculty of the Mastery of the University of Salerno. The Campus grew in few years with new Faculties that contributed to building an important center.

The Faculty of Philosophy was built in 1969; the Faculty of Economics was built in 1970; The Faculty of Mathematics, Physics and Natural Sciences, together with the Faculty of Law, were built in 1972; The Master Degree in Engineering (1983); Faculty of Pharmacy (1991); Faculty of Political Science (1992); Faculty of Foreign Languages and Literature (1996); Faculty of Medicine and Surgery (2006).

From 1987 the University is located inside the Campus of Fisciano, a few Km away from Salerno, which can be reached easily thanks to the several highways built around it.



UNISA is constantly growing, covering an area of 100.000 square meters. Currently made up of 2 Campuses, Fisciano and Baronissi, the University has got Residences for students and professors, modern facilities and efficient services for orientation, learning, studying and leisure. It currently has 40.000 students from Campania, Basilicata, Calabria and Puglia.



UNIVERSITY OF SALERNO



There are 17 Departments in Fisciano. The Campus of Baronissi is meant to have the Faculty of Medicine and Surgery "Scuola Medica Salernitana". The constant connection between the two Campuses is guaranteed by an intercampus shuttle, which is free. 83 courses are active at the University, offering all the 40.000 students advanced courses involved in an international context: PHD, masters, specialization and upgrading courses complete the offer proposed. Research centers, modern labs, computerized rooms make sure that the students get a precious support to their learning. Innovation is the constant commitment of UNISA. 35% of electric needs is self-produced by the photovoltaic plants. The future goal is to reach 80% of self-made energy. The cooperation between the University, the territory and the enterprises made possible the Spin-off incubator, which aims to sustain the development of innovative management projects. The Campus is a multifunctional area that offers numerous services. The two great Libraries are efficient areas for study and research. The ERASMUS office coordinates international projects and cooperation deals, incentivizing the students' mobility of students and professors in foreign Campuses. The Language Center focuses on teaching 9 languages together with the course of Italian to foreigners. The Orientation and Tutoring Center supports the relationship between schools and university, helping students during their university career. The Center carries out the project "Future students of the Campus": a tour guide of the Campus and a detailed explanation of the services offered by the University. Moreover, the CAOT has been hosting UNISA Orienta for 16 years, welcoming students and teachers from High Schools.

At the end of the University career, the Placement Office of UNISA helps the former students enter the professional world, providing them with useful tools to search for the right opportunity in Italy or abroad. The "Campus made for students" also provides dormitories, cafeterias, sports venues, a theatre and an aula magna.



CUS SALERNO

CUS Salerno (University Sports Centre) is the official sports centre of the university. It plays a key role in promoting sports and physical activity among students and university staff.

It offers numerous disciplines, including athletics, football, volleyball, martial arts and fitness, and organizes competitions, tournaments and recreational activities, contributing to university life and student well-being. CUS Salerno considers the university sports experience as complementary to that gained during secondary and extracurricular education, and as a moment of education, growth, commitment and social interaction, aligning its actions with human and civic values in the service of individuals and the local area. It also views sports as an essential component of cultural, educational and leisure activities within the university environment, encompassing the entire course of life. Moreover, as part of the national network of University Sports Centres (CUSI), it also participates in inter-university events at regional and national levels.

Thanks to its ongoing work — also on an international scale — CUS Salerno has established itself as an tireless engine of initiatives that place sport at the heart of students' personal and collective development.

Visa Procedure

Since Italy belongs to the Schengen area, all citizens from other EU/SEE State members can enter the territory by simply having an identity card. The following citizens can travel without a visa: the citizens of 25 out of 27 EU State members (Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Greece, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland), as well as Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein. Due EU State members (Cyprus and Ireland) do not belong to the Schengen area. Citizens of all non-Schengen member States are required to obtain a visa, which they can apply for at the diplomatic mission or consular post of their country of residence or at the diplomatic mission or consular post of a Schengen member State. Schengen visa and entry rules apply to short stays of less than 90 days. Rules for those who are staying longer than 90 days are established by the national legislation of each Member State.

Medical service

Medical care will be provided and an ambulance will be permanently placed at the venues and at the Athletes' village, even during training sessions. Medical care will be provided by the Hospital S. Giovanni di Dio d'Aragona in Salerno and by the Hospital Gaetano Fucito in Mercato San Severino.

Safety guard

Safety will be granted in every place to guarantee a safe stay to all participants.

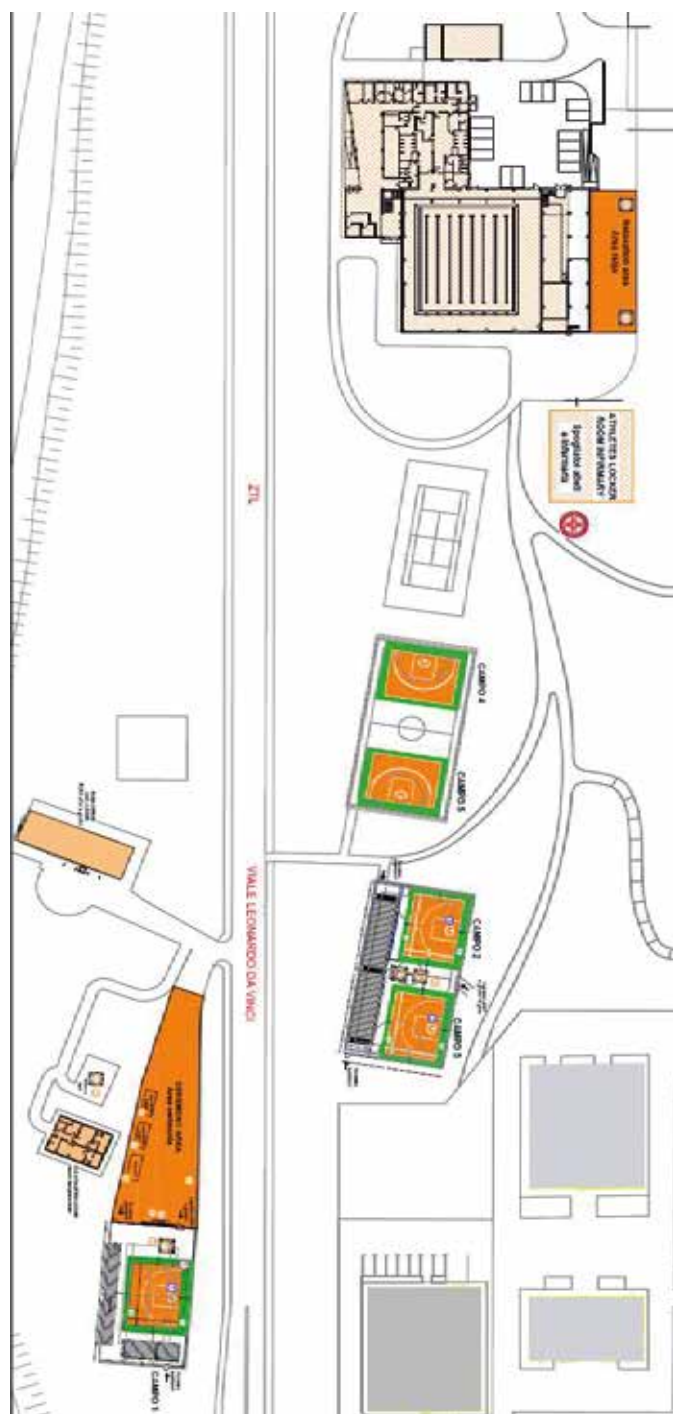

ACCREDITATION

Accreditation Center

The main Accreditation Center is located inside of the University Canteen. Address: Via della Tecnica. Accreditation will occur on July 31st 2025. The Accreditation Center will be open on the day of arrivals from 8:00am to 11:00pm. The other days will be open from 8:00am to 8:00pm.

Required Documents

Athletes and managers:

- Passport or Identity Card
- Individual registration form

Accreditation card:

The accreditation card is the only official and valid document for participants in the 2025 3x3 basketball championship, therefore it must always be visible to access the reserved areas of the event. Access will be monitored using Accreditation Cards, which will be checked at all site entrances. Whoever does not have an Accreditation Card or has a Card that does not have the required access rights will not be authorized to enter.

Misuse of personal Accreditation Cards is punishable by law and will be reported to the Security Team.

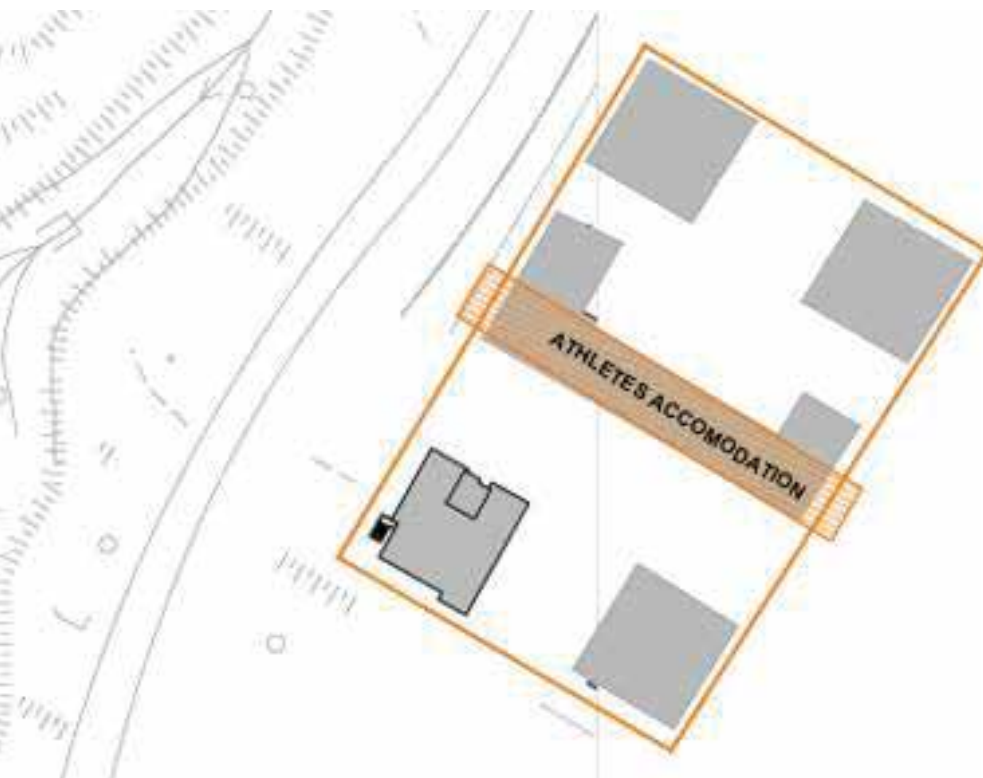
Loss of accreditation card:

In case you lose your accreditation card, you must go in person to the OC Accreditation Center and report the loss with a valid identification document (passport or ID card). Requests for replacement cards must be submitted directly to the Accreditation Center, where new cards will be printed. A new accreditation card will cost €50 and must be paid on-site.



ATHLETES' AND TEAM OFFICIALS' VILLAGE

The Residences are located in the Fisciano Campus, close to the competition area. Living the Athletes' Village will allow the participants to share their own experiences and getting a real taste of the atmosphere of the European Sport Games. All Residences have their own meeting rooms and have got their own free wi-fi. All rooms are comfortable, furnished in a modern style and currently in excellent condition.

Quiet Hours

To ensure a peaceful environment for all participants, quiet hours are enforced from 23:00 to 07:00 in all accommodation areas.

During these hours, loud music, gatherings, and any disturbing activities are strictly prohibited.

Alcohol Policy

The consumption and possession of alcoholic beverages are not allowed inside the dormitories. Violations may result in disciplinary actions, including removal from the residence.



CATERING

The University canteen is located near the athletes' residences and can be considered the flagship of the University of Salerno. It will provide breakfast, lunch, and dinner during the games with varied and balanced menus in compliance with current regulations, including specific meals for athletes with allergies.

The canteen can serve approximately 3,000 athletes daily for breakfast, lunch, and dinner, appropriately distributed within specific time slots. All the meals for the Officials and the Referees will be served at their hotels. When they are not engaged in competitions, a pocket lunch is planned for the days on which the officials and referees will be busy at the competition facilities of the event.

TRANSPORTATION

Salerno and its province, with approximately 1 million inhabitants, enjoy an excellent geographical location. Overlooking the sea, the town serves as a bridge between central, northern, and southern Italy. Salerno is well connected by rail, road, and highway. It is just 54 km from Naples-Capodichino International Airport, which handled approximately 11,000,000 passengers in 2019, with 82,577 movements (takeoffs and landings) to 15 domestic and 91 international destinations, operated by 42 different airlines. Napoli-Capodichino can be reached from all over Europe in about 3–4 hours by plane. Moreover, the brand-new Salerno-Pontecagnano Airport is expected to be fully operational by 2025 — just in time to plan potential direct connections with selected European destinations. Salerno is the crossroad of two important highways: A1 and A3. Therefore, the EUC 2025 venues in Fisciano and Salerno can be easily reached, even by car, as well as by train, considering that Salerno is served by one of the most efficient high-speed rail networks in Italy. The highway that links Northern and Southern Italy also passes directly through Salerno and Fisciano. Both towns have their own local and provincial bus services, reaching several areas. Transfers from/to airports: All participating teams will be picked up and accompanied to and from the airport by the official transfer company, Cisalpina. Shuttle service will be available from both Naples-Capodichino International Airport and Salerno-Pontecagnano Airport. At arrivals, teams should look for EUSA Staff members holding a dedicated banner for assistance and guidance.

Campus shuttle service: A free internal campus shuttle runs every 30 minutes. It departs from the Bus Terminal near the accreditation area, stops at the residences, reaches the competition courts, and returns to the starting point. This service ensures a smooth connection between the accommodation facilities, the dining areas, and the sports venues within the campus.

A free shuttle service will be available throughout the event to facilitate transportation between the residences, canteen, and match venues.

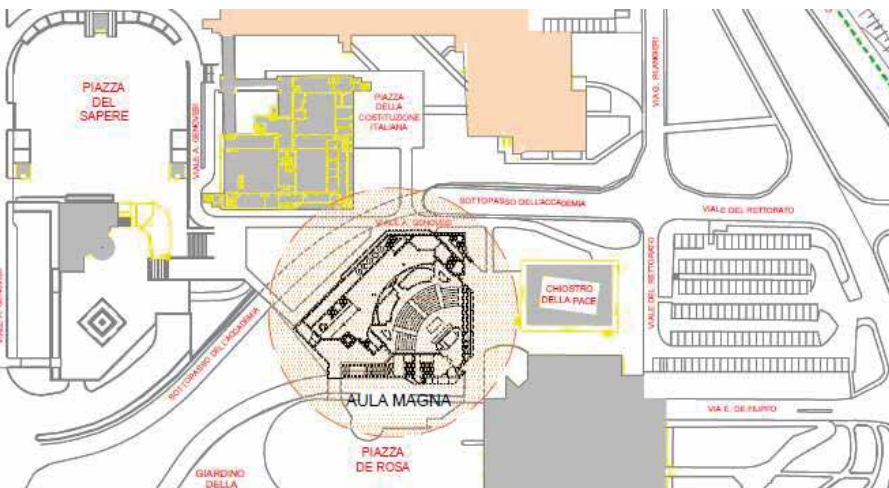

Rules and Regulations

The organization of EUC 3x3 basketball will be based primarily on the latest technical regulations of the International Basketball Federation (FIBA). The draw will be conducted in the presence of the EUSA representative, taking into account the EUSA 3x3 basketball rankings. The host city's university team or, in its absence, the highest ranked team from the host country will be placed first (1) in Pool A. Teams from the same country, where possible, will be placed in different pools.

Official Basket Balls

Basket balls approved by FIBA for the 3x3 basketball.

Schedule

The competition will last 4 (four) days. The GTM (General Technical Meeting), which is mandatory for every Head of Delegation, will be held 1 (one) day before the beginning of the competition.

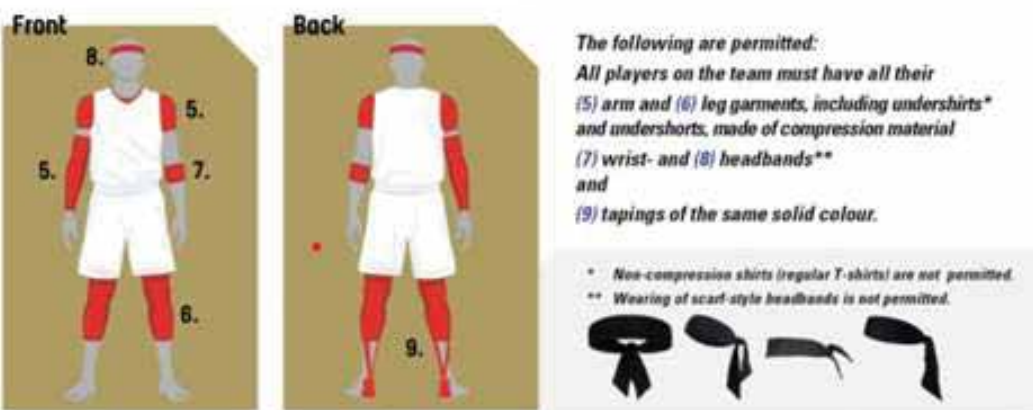
Delegation

The delegation will be made up of a minimum of 3 (three) to a maximum of 4 (four) athletes. The Head of the Delegation must be appointed.

Uniform

All teams must wear two different sets of uniforms, one light-colored and one dark-colored. All players from the same university must wear the same uniform. Each player must wear the same jersey number throughout the entire tournament. Each team must have two sets of uniforms in contrasting colors (e.g., light and dark).

ANTIDOPING POLICY

Doping is not a guarantee of success in sport. In fact, its effect is usually the opposite. A lot of elite sportsmen and sportswomen who did doping got caught. As a result, they lost pride and were banned for at least 2 years from participating in a sport they loved and lived for. An even bigger problem of doping are the effects on the body. In elite sports, doping is defined as a violation of one or more anti-doping rules:

- Presence of a prohibited substance in an athlete's sample.
- Use or attempted use of a prohibited substance or method.
- Refusing to submit sample collection after being notified.
- Failure to file athlete whereabouts information & missed test.
- Tampering with any part of the doping control process.
- Possession of a prohibited substance or method.
- Trafficking a prohibited substance or method.
- Administering or attempting to administer a prohibited substance or method to an athlete.

You can find the list of prohibited substances and methods on the internet, as it is updated every year by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) and it's valid for every sport.



EUSA is active in Anti-Doping promotion, and has been a partner in the European Anti-Doping Initiative (EADIn) and Match point, supporting European-wide Anti-Doping mentality in the youth sector by establishing a moral tenor towards concepts such as Fair-play, sensitizing and raising awareness on all levels of the complex social environment surrounding the doping problematic, and implementing strategies to motivate young people to pass on the message and create a strong multiplying effect. Also, the International University Sport Federation (FISU) has been actively promoting sports without drugs, also at the university sports level. EUSA is currently not enforcing doping tests at our events. In accordance with the national legislation of the host countries, however, doping controls may be implemented by the National Anti-Doping Agencies. If such doping tests are executed, the WADA rules and regulations are applicable to all athletes. Please remember that testing can be conducted in-competition and out-of-competition. If you are identified in a Registered Testing Pool (RTP), you must provide current and accurate whereabouts information.

What can you do to be an excellent athlete?

- Practice right and live healthy
- Get more information about the consequences of Doping
- Play fair and be a good role model to younger athletes
- Be committed to sport without doping

FAIR PLAY

Fair play is a core value of EUSA, deeply embedded in our mission and activities. In partnership with the European Fair Play Movement (EFPM), we actively promote sportsmanship, respect, and solidarity at all our events. For over 20 years, EUSA has championed these values, recognising fair play as the true essence of sport. Fair play is present in sports as the unwritten rule, a moral value that represents the real essence of sport. It represents that opponents must be appreciated and in nowadays practising of sports, more than ever, it is vitally important to defend the values intrinsic to sport:

respect for oneself and others, solidarity, and fair play. Since 2007, EUSA has honoured outstanding acts of fair play with the Enno Harms Fair Play Award, named after our first President and a strong advocate for fair play. At each event, organisers, delegates, and participants commit to upholding fair play, with the oath of respect and integrity declared during the Opening Ceremony.

The prestigious annual EUSA Enno Harms Fair Play Award is awarded to athletes demonstrating fair play during the matches, following the rules, and pursuing a "clean" game, and is awarded with a fair play recognition already during the event. EUSA Executive Committee members discuss the proposals received from all sporting events governed by EUSA in that year and select the team or individual to receive the Enno Harms Fair Play award, which is formally handed to them at a special occasion, usually at the EUSA Gala. Fair play will remain a key focus at the European Universities Championships 2025.



Guided by EUSA's principles and the Olympic spirit, our events promote respect, equality, and non-discrimination, contributing to a more inclusive and peaceful society through sport. We kindly invite all delegations to submit proposals for the Enno Harms Fair Play Award, recognising individuals or university teams who have demonstrated exemplary behaviour, integrity, and sportsmanship during the Championships.

One of the Fundamental Principles of Olympism is that “practice of sport is a human right” and that “every individual must have the possibility of practising sport, without discrimination of any kind”. This principle further states that this requires a behaviour based on “mutual understanding with a spirit of friendship, solidarity and fair play”.

EUSA considers sports as an active tool in the education of university students and aims at encouraging and supporting “the promotion of ethics, Fair Play, gender equity and good governance in sport” (EUSA Statutes). With the EUSA Incident Policy, EUSA clarifies the expectations and consequences regarding the behaviour of different stakeholders at EUSA's events to allow the creation of a safe and enjoyable environment.

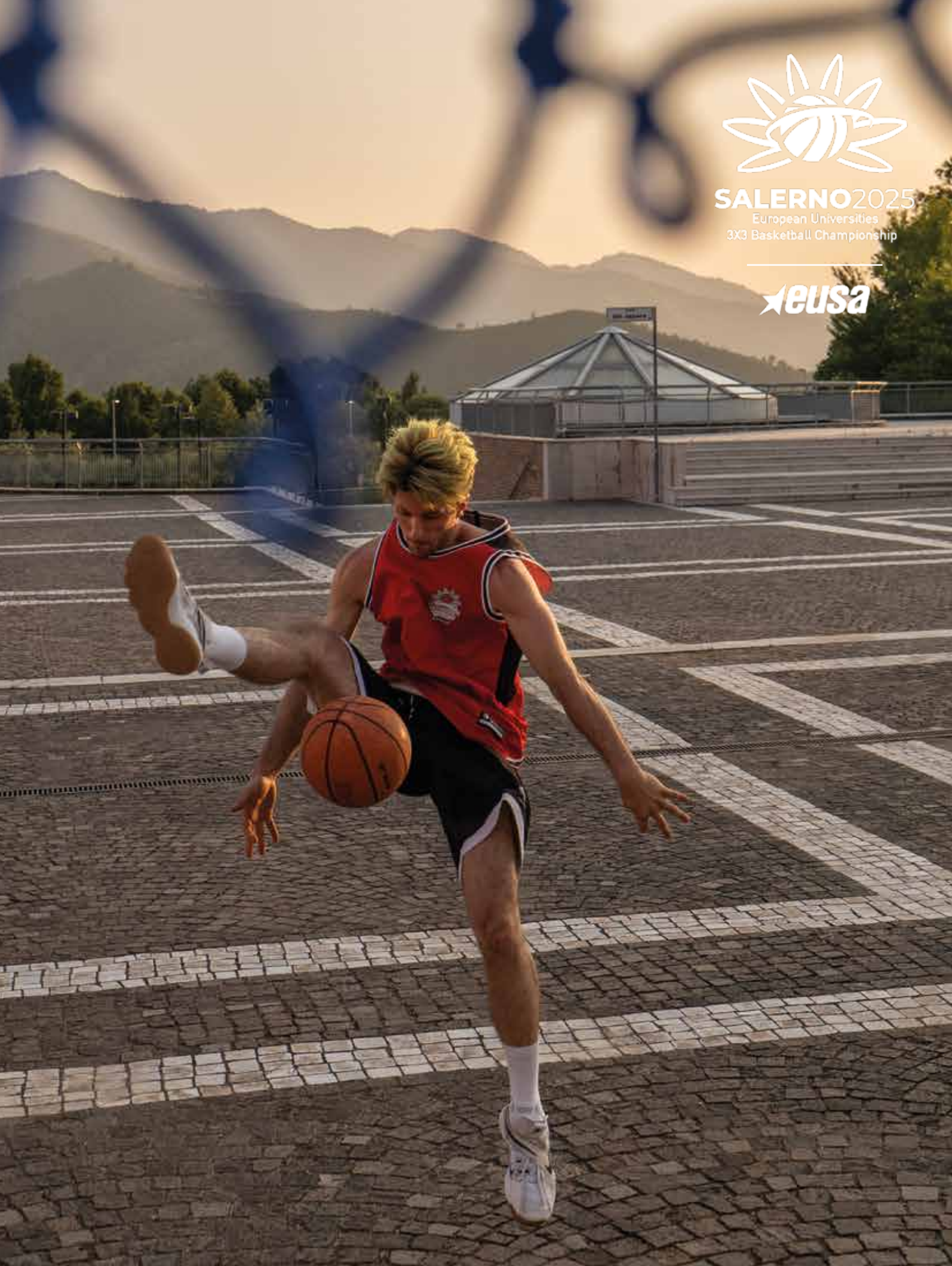
